About University of Hyogo

The University of Hyogo was established in 2004 by merging three long-standing prefectural universities: Kobe University of Commerce, Himeji Institute of Technology and College of Nursing Art and Science Hyogo.

Today, the University is one of the leading public universities in Japan, consisting of six faculties, nine graduate schools, five research institutes and affiliated junior and senior high schools spread across nine diverse campuses in Hyogo Prefecture. The number of students and graduate students currently enrolled is approximately 6,700, and the total number of graduates, including those from the three predecessors, has surpassed 70,000.

Our first goal is to nurture independent and flexible intellects with deep knowledge, good judgment and entrepreneurial spirit who can build bridges rather than walls between people.

Our second goal is to contribute through interdisciplinary, innovative and practical research activities to solving the various challenges facing the world. We will promote

industry-government-academia collaboration globally and return the results to society through university-launched ventures and start-up support.

Our third goal is to present a vision of a prosperous and diverse future society and to create new value and hope. The University is committed to fulfilling its role as a public institution from a global perspective, guided by the SDGs' principle of "leaving no one behind."

MICE Initiatives

The University is actively engaged in MICE (Meetings, Incentive Tours, Conventions, and Exhibitions) projects in cooperation with the local community, especially Himeii City.

Himeji City, where two of the University's campuses are located, has international tourism resources, most notably Himeji Castle, Japan's first World Cultural Heritage Site. With tangible assets such as international conference and accommodation facilities, Himeji has been designated as an international convention and tourism city.



Leading-edge Research Facilities: NewSUBARU and Fugaku

At the University of Hyogo, researchers can use world-class research facilities such as the NewSUBARU synchrotron radiation facility and the Fugaku supercomputer. This enables them not only to conduct basic research but also to engage in research focusing on industrial uses and social implementation. These facilities can be used by conducting joint research with university-affiliated researchers.

Arcrea Himeji is a large-scale facility complex which opened in 2021 as a new exchange hub. It is equipped with small, medium, and grand halls with different scales and functions, a large pillar-free exhibition hall with an area of about 4,000 square meters, and 10 meeting rooms that can be used for various purposes.
